Family Center Possibility

We are currently looking into forming a Family Center at Arcadia to strengthen the partnership between our school and families to enhance every child's education and learning experience. A family center can help parents do the following:

- Communicate with your child's teacher
- Offer classes for adults like English classes, early childhood education, basic computer skills, wellness classes and more
- Be a resource connection for in-person and virtual presentations, access food and healthcare resources, obtain car seats, citizenship and more

The district is currently having trouble staffing family centers in the district with a Family Center Connector that is required to be there to run the center. If you or you happen to know of someone in the community that speaks Spanish and would be interested in this position, please let me know.

Considering our current economic environment, I thought we did amazingly well with our "Out of This World" fundraiser. Assessment Data Update

At the beginning of the year, students were given an Acadience Reading and Math assessment to create a baseline from which we will be able to measure their academic growth in those subjects. Students were also given an i-Ready Math diagnostic test to assess their mathematical skills thus far. Throughout the last quarter and into the second, teachers give frequent tests/quizzes called Common Formative Assessments (CFAs) that help them guide their instruction and group students according to their learning needs.

We will now begin giving the middle of year assessments in Acadience Reading and Math to analyze the data from the beginning of the year until now to determine if students are making adequate growth and progress towards their learning goals. Teachers usually share this data with parents at SEPs in February. We are planning to have student-led conferences then where your student will show you his/her data notebook and explain to you how he/she is progressing in each subject and with his/her behavior. The teacher will facilitate the discussion, but the student will do most of the explaining.

In the meantime, if you want to check on your student's progress, you can always login to the <u>Granite Portal</u> to access Gradebook or contact the teacher.

Attendance Statistics & Incentive Programs

The following are the attendance statistics for Arcadia from the beginning of the school year until now:

We have noticed this year that there have been a lot of absences.

Teachers are reporting that they have an average of 4 or 5 students missing each day. To improve our attendance, we are participating in the district's Everyday Counts program. I announce classes that have 100% attendance each day over the announcements, and they get an attendance pencil and are entered into the drawing for the Quarterly Principal's Party. Teachers have also been tasked to call parents of chronically absent students to see how they and the school can help.

The PTA is also involved and presented students who had 100% attendance in the first quarter with a certificate at our last assembly. The PTA will give certificates for 100% attendance every month from here on out. A picture of the students who received certificates is below.



It is of upmost importance to be at school as much as possible, so students don't get behind on their learning. Many students, because of COVID, have severe learning gaps and need time at school to fill in the holes in their learning. Thank you to those who have your students attend regularly. Lockout Drill & Emergency Drill Overview

To increase safety at all Granite School District schools, the emergency protocols have been updated to align with standardized protocols throughout the country. These updated procedures are as follows:

<section-header> Potential threat to student safety OFF campus All outdoor activities are canceled and students/staff are brought inside Exterior doors are locked Likely police presence on site Activities and instruction continues inside the school Students may move around inside the building as necessary. Visitors not allowed in the building unless otherwise directed

LOCKDOWN

- Threat to student safety ON campus or inside the building
- Students and staff move to classrooms and lock doors
- Students and staff move out of sight away from doors and windows
- Doors remain locked and students may not leave for any reason.
- Emergency personnel unlock classroom doors after situation is resolved
- No visitors or parents permitted on campus until authorized by emergency personnel



RUN, HIDE, FIGHT


In a situation where someone is actively seeking to cause harm on the campus, staff members will use situational awareness to assess the circumstances as best they can. Using this information, they will lead students to either: **RUN** - if a clear path escape if available;

 MDG - if the attacker seems near or escape is not feasible;

 FIGHT - as a last resort if confronted

EVACUATION

- Building is compromised due to hazard, natural disaster/incident, or other situation where students and staff must leave the building
- All students and staff exit using predetermined exit routes
- Students and staff gather at designated evacuation site
- Students and staff remain at evacuation until all clear is issued by emergency personnel
- If incident is prolonged, reunification process is initiated with parents/guardians picking up students



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COMMUNICATING TO PARENTS

Communication during emergency situations will occur as quickly as possible. All available forms of relaying messages will be used, including the school's phone system and district social media accounts.

Please remember that information will not be relayed until all students are safely accounted for, and all information is accurate. Please ensure your contact information is up to date with the school, including any changes to email addresses, cellphone numbers or home phone numbers.

Parents should not call the school unless instructions indicate otherwise. Staff members are not permitted to give out information during a crisis, and calling the school may block phone lines and take away resources.



Our next lockout drill will be on December 19^{th} at 1:30 p.m. Our lockdown drill will be in January on the 25^{th} at 9:30 a.m. Our earthquake drill is scheduled for April 26^{th} at 1:30 p.m. but may change because we are participating in the Great Utah Shakeout and may change the date depending on when the shakeout takes place. We will let you know if we change it.

If you happen to be at the school during these times, please wait outside until an office staff member comes to unlock the door as no

one is permitted to come in or out of the building during these drills. The rest of the drills will be our regular fire drills that happen monthly. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns about the new protocols, drills or anything safety related. If you would like information on our School Emergency Response Plan (SERP), please let me know.

Recess Skill of the Month

I just wanted to let you know that during morning announcements, I remind students what our recess skill of the month is. I thought I would let you know the skills we are concentrating on for the year. They are:

- **September** Be kind to one another while at play and in conversation.
- October Be respectful to everyone.
- November Be resilient and flexible when you don't get your way.
- **December** Communicate well and express your needs appropriately.
- January Share with others and be willing to take turns.
- February Have good sportsmanship and play nicely.
- **March** Be friendly and include others in games you play.
- **April** Remember SWAT: If someone is being disrespectful to you, remember to tell them to stop. If they don't stop, walk away. If they still won't stop, tell an adult.
- **May** Accept other students' differences and include them in your recess activities.

Teachers have been emphasizing these skills to their students before they go out to recess; however, I would like you to be aware of them and follow up with your child on how he/she is coming along practicing them throughout the day.
