Attendance is very important during the next few months!



For students to do well on their tests, they need to be at school regularly so they can learn what they need to and be able to take the tests when they are scheduled. In last months' newsletter, I included this year's testing schedule so you will know when to schedule appointments and activities for your children.

- Come to school regularly and be rested, relaxed, and ready to test.
- o Believe in yourself. Think positive thoughts.
- Stay focused. Take a quick break if you need to.
- o Take deep breaths to relax.
- Use strategies your teacher has taught you to figure out each answer.
- o Take your time. Don't give up!
- o Give every question your BEST effort.
- Remember your goals and work towards them.



Kindergarten Registration & Orientation

Kindergarten registration is on March 3rd from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. We will only have parents fill out registration cards and receive paper information during this time. Kindergarten Orientation will be tentatively scheduled for August 16th (the day before Kindergarten begins). During Kindergarten Orientation, the teachers will present, our school nurse will speak, we will inform parents about PTA and Community Council opportunities and



students and parents will go to the classroom to hear their teacher read them a short story. If you know of parents who will have a kindergartener next year, please let them know about Kindergarten Registration and Orientation. We would like to know early how many kindergarteners we will have so we can adjust staffing accordingly.

PTA/Community Council Digital Citizenship Initiative



A virtual assembly was presented to all students on Wednesday, February 8, 2023, to provide the necessary student training on media and Internet safety. The training was also for teaching students and parents about smart uses of technology (digital citizenship). The assembly was in partnership with NetSmartz which is an organization affiliated with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

To better help parent and their children communicate about Internet and screen use, Arcadia's School

Community Council and PTA have partnered together to bring resources to you. The PTA sent home an Internet Safety Pledge and Family Screen-time Contract that were provided to each student at Arcadia to help begin, and continue, these parent/child discussions. It is our hope that you will sit down with your child and discuss ways to which they can be safe and stay alert while using media and navigating the Internet. It is also our hope you will discuss together


Arcadia Art Night!


Spring Break


