- 1. Reviewed book reconsideration process. Two handouts were provided to show the process of selection and deselection. This process can be found on the district's website.

  - c. Book selection is done by Librarians and material techs with direction from the district.

### 2023/2024 School Plan Review (20 min)- Council Members

O Discussion and voting on 2023/2024 school plan.

Mr. Graham proposed the school plan for the 2023/2024 school year.

• Goal: At least 60% of students will be at benchmark or above benchmark on the End of Year Acadience Reading assessment.

- Currently the average school score is at mid 30%. The decision to use Acadience scores over RISE scores was due to the fact the RISE scores aren't released until the next year and only covers grades 3-5. Acadience spans all grades.
- The goal is big, however, the goal of 60% meets the State and District expectations.
- Academic Area: English/Language Arts (ELA)
  - This is a simplified plan and it was determined to use ELA because math is based on reading.
- Measurements: Acadience Reading Beginning of the Year, Middle of the Year and End of Year assessments.
- Action Plan Steps:
  - o Administer Acadience Reading assessments three times a year.
  - o Progress monitor intensive, strategic and core students.
  - Students will log onto Amira consistently to help fill in knowledge gaps.
  - Lower grades (K-2nd) will use Phonics 2.0 and Heggerty programs.
  - o Upper grades will use the 95% Group's Multisyllabic program.
  - Teachers will use the school's Dyad Reading and Lexile libraries as needed.
  - Teachers will continue to teach from the district provided basil reading program.
  - Lower grade teachers will coordinate with paraprofessionals

     (aides) to work with intensive/strategic students in small groups to
     target concepts that need to be retaught.
  - Upper grade teachers will work with admin, the instructional and technology coaches, and district experts to develop or hone teaching best practices to improve students' reading proficiency.
  - o Teachers will meet in professional learning communities often.
  - For writing assignments, teachers will be expected to use organizational tools such as: graphic organizers, lists, outlines, concept maps, and the Cornell method for taking notes.
  - All students will track their reading data and present their progress to parents throughout the year.
  - Teachers will be expected to work towards achieving at least 80% active engagement in whole group instruction.
