Staffing Needs for 2023-24

The following positions will be available for the 2023-24 school year. Most jobs will be posted by June 1, 2023.

- Principal's Secretary (Job will be posted on May 1, 2023).
- Kindergarten Aide 29 hours a week.
- Upper Grade Special Education Resource Aide 29 hours a week.
- **Special Education Self Contained Aide** 29 hours a week.
- Lunch Playground Aide 10 hours a week. (May be combined with another position to total 29 hours a week.)
- **Progress Monitoring Testing Aide** 19 hours a week. (May be combined with another position to total 29 hours a week.)
- **Upper Grade Classroom Aide** 29 hours a week.
- Evening Sweepers 10 to 15 hours a week after school.
- **Volunteers** No hour limit. This is for volunteers who would be with students alone in the classroom or on field trips. (Requires a fee, fingerprinting and background check.)

If you or anyone you know is interested in any of these positions, please look for the postings on the district website. You will need to fill out an application, upload the required documents and inform me via email you have applied. I usually don't post volunteer jobs unless requested by a parent or patron. Postings are on the website for one week. I then look at the postings and

contact applicants to interview for the position. Please feel free to post these positions on your own social media accounts.

Summer Feeding Programs

Summer Pandemic Grocery Benefits

This summer the USDA is offering the **last Pandemic EBT (PEBT) funding** to assist families in purchasing groceries for their students. Families will qualify for the one-time payment of \$120.00 per eligible student this summer if they qualify for <u>free/reduced meal benefits</u>.
