Item 1: Steve Hogan- Granite School District Director of Planning & Boundaries - Steve Hogan **4:10-4:40**

snhogan@graniteschools.org 385-646-4409 His secretary Kathy Farnsworth, his secretary will answer. The area around Armstrong will be a part of a boundary study for the next school year.

Process- They go a calendar year. They start in January and end in December. It is done this way so there is time to make changes for the next school year. Any changes will not happen for this upcoming school year (2016-2017).

During the boundary study year, the school board can cancel the study at anytime.

Mr. Hogan will meet with the board again in June, and after that every month until December. He advises the board, he doesn't make the decisions. There is a population analysis committee that studies the boundary and makes proposals, but the School Board makes the decision.

Mr. Hogan will join for additional council meetings and there will be open houses and surveys involved with the study. The Armstrong boundaries are in the exploratory phase, nothing is for sure. The fall of the 2017-2018 would be the soonest that a boundary change would occur if the board approves a proposal.

Mr. Hogan will be gathering more data and will visit one more time with the council before the end of the school year to let us know the status of the study.

Item 2: Armstrong Staffing Plan for 2016-2017 School Year- Matt Goebel 4:40- 5:20

The projection for next year are listed below. Armstrong is projected to have 787 students next year. The school is projected to have approximately 28.9 FTE to staff the school. The council is voting for a modified version of option A. This would mean Armstrong would have 2 teachers in Kindergarten, 4 teachers in 1st grade, 5 teachers in 2nd grade, 5 teachers in 3rd grade, 4 teachers in 4th grade, 4 teachers in 5th grade, and 4 teachers in 6th grade. Kyle Cannon motions to approve, Carrie Divall 2nds the vote, all approved.
