MINUTES -SEPTEMBER 20, 2022

1. Introduction of members
2. Distributed and explained SCC handbook that reviews role and goals of SCC. Emailed SCC digital handbook.
3. All members emailed training videos - please watch and let the principal know of any questions before the next meeting.
4. Elect chair and vice-chair (Heather Zoglmann Chair & Jessica Thornton Vice Chair)
5. Report on last year's implementation and success of LAND Trust. School was given \$46,909 dollars and planned to pay for half a Kindergarten teacher's salary which allowed Bacchus to implement Early Literacy Intervention (OEK) for the 21-22 school year. Our goal was to get 60% of Kindergarteners to exit with a proficiency level 3 (grade level) for literacy on the end of year KEEP assessment, and 80% of kindergarteners with a proficiency level for numeracy. Funding was also used to provide substitutes for PLC time, procure books to expand guided reading library, purchase teacher supplies for professional development, offer professional development to teachers and paraeducators, and buy equipment, supplies, and software. In March of 2022, we amended the plan to purchase BOXLIGHT interactive panels for classrooms to support instruction and student engagement. The results of the Exit KEEP scores were as follows: Literacy 19% were a proficiency level 3; Numeracy 70% were a proficiency level 3.
6. This year's LAND Trust plan and Continual Improvement Plan
For 2022-2023 school year, Bacchus was given \$47,704 dollars and planned to pay for half Kindergarten teacher's salary which allowed us to implement Early literacy Intervention (OEK). The goal is the same as last year: 60% of students have a proficiency level 3 in Literacy and 80% of students have a proficiency level 3 in Numeracy. We also plan to use funds to pay for PLC assistants to cover classes while teachers meet in weekly PLC meetings to problem solve student learning using data to guide instruction. The measurement tool will be the end of year RISE assessment and our goal is to increase our Math by 5 percentage points in 3rd-5th grades.
7. Determine how the school will "provide for education and awareness on safe technology utilization and digital citizenship that empowers a student to make smart media and online choices: (H.B. 213) We will look into having an internet safety assembly, incorporating internet safety with our PLC time where PLC assistants are in classes working with students on Chromebooks. We will also have information out for families during SEP nights, and talk to PTA about having a white ribbon week.
8. Review Proficiency-Based Learning Student Bill of Rights & Responsibilities. Briefly explained what PBL is, and sent handouts with SCC members to review.
9. Additional items we discussed were having Family Nights that showcased academics, as well as art. With covid being less, we will discuss during leadership meetings what that could look like this year, and hopefully start a tradition that builds over the years.
