Summary of previous meeting is outlined in the November minutes located on the school's website under community council in archived minutes

- Call meeting to order and get started
- Distance learning
 - District asked the schools to create
 - For making up a snow day
 - Proactive
 - Keep consistent
 - Sending home Chromebook or packets?
 - Will be packets
 - Sent out an email DOJO message about the learning day
 - Specific for emergency use only
 - Teachers will be available via DOJO, email messages, phone calls for help or support
 - Not to be a 7 hour packet, will be review material
 - Teachers are not expected to be in school but will be available during school hours
- Cell Phone policy
 - District has blanket policy, shouldn't impede learning or the learning of others
 - @beehive the policy is phones are turned off when entering the building (silent, or off)
 - Can be given to the teacher
 - Out of sight out of mind, not visible during school hours
 - Kids should be focused on school and not their phones
 - Can keep them in pockets or backpacks
 - Is a temptation
 - If visible the teacher will remind to put away, if it becomes a problem, phone goes to the principal
 - Parents can call the office, or class DOJO the teacher to get a hold of the kids
 - No taking pictures of other students, taking videos, etc., it is a privacy issue and need to be adhered to
 - Not an unreasonable expectation
 - Mrs. Pate will send out an email in December to families about cell phone policy

- When leaving school kids can turn their phones back on
- Inside day protocol
 - How cold is too cold: 22 degrees or higher- outside day, 21 degrees and lower inside day
 - Use the feels like temperature from weather bug
 - Depends on how kids are dressed for the day
 - Some kids don't have access to warm clothing
 - Doors are open at 8 am
 - First kids are around 810 am, 820 am more kids start to come in
 - Teachers concern is monitoring the amount of kids that show up
 - Must bring kids into the building during inside days
 - Kids go to their classrooms
 - Aids monitor the hallways
 - Kindergarten go into the gym with one adult watching the kids
 - Once teachers are there kids go into the classrooms
 - Social workers watch for kids that don't have access to coats and appropriate clothing
 - Trying to find a balance to keep kids warm, and managing resources
 - Since COVID kids go to the classroom instead of the gym
 - Parents try not to drop off any earlier than needed to avoid the cold temperatures
 - Mrs. Pate will start tracking temps and inside days
 - Once inside days are called, kids stay inside they won't go back outside
 - Teacher have the discretion to determine if it's an outside/inside day for recesses
- PTA events
 - No events coming up
- School events
 - Jacques reached out to the oval
 - Supply-a-thon: Monday December 5th, 2022 630pm-9pm
 - Wont be specific
 - Will have a flyer go out for ideas of what to get the teachers
 - Will come out in an email and a flyer
 - Will have containers and distribute among the teachers equally
 - Jacques husband will have containers made to drop supplies in
 - December 20, 21
 - 20th will be Polar Express day movie in the morning and the afternoon
 - Pajama Day
 - Parent sing around 9-930am
 - Parent sing around 245-315pm
 - December 21 kids will perform their songs for the school
 - Mrs. Pate would reach out to Jared in accounting to get donation ideas for pajamas for the kids for a community service project

 - Need to get more male involvement within the school
