

Counselor update - Michelle already tracking down and enrolling new students. FTE numbers will be in next Friday and there will be a new student enrollment open house

Principal report - 100 kids down from where we were in the past so we took in 80 permits to bump our numbers back up.

How are we doing with our Landtrust budget? Pretty good because of the amendments that were approved. We used Landtrust funds to keep an English teacher this year.

Michelle Benson - How are we doing with grades and testing this year? Principal Stevens doesn't know exact numbers because the testing hasn't been done this year. Her opinion is that distance learning students are struggling with engagements in the class. The district is still planning on doing distance learning next year so they have to figure out how to fix that. The in-person 9th graders who are working on credit recovery and recovering some core credits.

Is there money available to help in this process? Ms. Ricks and Nelson are helping with the process during extra periods so money is being used to help. It is very successful for students that just have a few credits to make up and they just need a little extra attention to get it done.

Are we going to be able to support these kids as they enter high school after such a weird school year? We don't have RISE testing scores from last year so we'll have to do bench level testing when they come into the JR high to see where they are at, but it doesn't tell us what they learned in the past.

Online summer classes are available through the counselors. Granite connect classes. More info to come on March 2nd.

Friday distance learning days will not stay that way next year. Teachers have enjoyed it and parents are split. The teachers are willing to give up their distance learning day to have kids in school.

Parents are concerned teachers are not updating grades even after SEPS. We don't give 3 assessments for each standard so there is a greater length of time between grades. The standards turn directly into zeros when they are added into grade book. The question is about assignments and assessments that have already been taken. If teachers aren't checking for updated grades it stays a zero.

Is proficiency based grading going to be staying the same? New super intendant coming so who knows? There are mixed feelings about it with the teachers so it just depends on how the board decides to go with it.

Timeline for new super intendant is to interview candidates through March and have a choice by the end of April.
