Preliminary Enrollment Numbers

Hiring / Retiring

Teachers have until March 1 to turn in their papers for retirement. As of right now, Josh has offered a position to L. Myers at Oakridge and she has accepted. We will not be able to look at hiring any others until we know which teachers will be going on to Skyline, and which teachers will be retiring.

Land Trust

Review of current Land Trust plan and the discussion for next year's Land Trust Plan. Most of the monies this year (\$41,218) went toward FTE and some smaller technology items. The amount for next year's Land Trust will be just over \$52,000. This will help fund FTE, Technology items such as additional Chrome Books and Carts, Classroom aides, etc. CTE helped fund extra periods for two of our teachers this year. We will lose the CTE funding next year when the 9th grade students go to the high school.
