Community Council:

Brief description of community council member duties and expectations. Members encouraged to attend one of the community council district sponsored trainings. October 21, 6:00 pm at the Granite Education Center or October 22, 6:00 pm at Olympus High. Community Council roster will be published on the web page. Let Cris know of any changes in information. Kim will email the Community Council Manual from the district to council members. It is lengthy and voluminous but very informational. Duties of council members are to review test scores, data etc. and decide where we can benefit most from LAND Trust monies and come up with a plan.

Principal's Update:

Enrollment is up from previously expected. Current enrollment is 578. Schedule was built for 535. Classes are full. Administration and counselors have been working on ways to alleviate some of the class loads and have come up with a couple of plans but we are waiting for confirmation from the district as to whether we need to take a surplus teacher from a school where enrollment has decreased, or we can hire and piece meal a bunch of the classes.

LAND Trust- The current plan is to help with the funding of 2 reading classes and 2 math lab classes. This has been done. Students were placed in these classes based on 2014 and 2015 SAGE scores along with teacher recommendation. If we are able to hire another teacher we will consider moving a couple of the reading and math lab classes to regular FTE and use LAND Trust monies elsewhere to help out overflow in other subject areas such as Family and Consumer Science, English and History.
