 - a) [HB215](#) "Utah Fits All" scholarship to help parents pay for their children's private school tuition and homeschooling supplies. \$239 million for \$6000 raises for teachers and 5,000 students to attend alternative schooling. Utah State Board of Education argued a teacher pay increase should not be attached to a voucher program because the issues are distinct and separate.
 - b) [HB477](#) funds full-day kindergarten. \$60 million with funding directly tied to the number of full-day kindergarten students (as part of the WPU: Weighted Pupil Unit) a district enrolls, implementation is not mandatory. Parents are not required to enroll in full-day; public schools are required to provide a half-day option if requested by families.

- c) [SB103](#) allows high school seniors to wear cultural or religious regalia at graduation ceremonies and [HB163](#) allows students to wear cultural and religious clothing as part of school sports uniforms.
- d) [HB427](#) "Individual Freedom in Public Education, prohibits teachers from dismissing or talking discriminately about religion in schools and allows students to pray at school.
- e) [HB 308](#) Substitutes school letter grade ranking with another reporting category. Must continue to adhere to Federal Law (Every Student Succeeds Act, Public Law No. 114-95), requiring public schools report performance in 5 ways:
 - (1) Academic achievement
 - (2) Academic progress
 - (3) English language proficiency
 - (4) High school graduation rates
 - (5) Any measure of the following areas:
 - (a) Kindergarten readiness
 - (b) Access to and completion of advanced coursework
 - (c) College readiness
 - (d) Discipline rates
 - (e) Chronic absenteeism
