Reflection on School Achievement Data:

What strengths stood out while reviewing student levels of achievement?

The school has eight enrollment periods throughout the year when we accept new students. Our enrollment at any given time is between 200-300 students. In our most recent grading period, 84% of classes were passed by students. Those that failed classes also had attendance issues.

What are areas of school "critical academic need"?

We had a very low percentage of 10th grade students score as proficient in their Aspire testing.

Based on this initial review of data, what are some *initial* ideas for needed schoolwide academic goals? Better alignment of classroom instruction to state/district standards.

Setting School Goals:

1-Academic Learning Goals

1a. Granite Connection High School had a graduation rate of 21% in the 2020-2021 school year. We have a goal of improving the graduation rate to 31% by the end of the 2022-2023 school year.

2-Social Skills and Dispositions Goals

2a. At the end of the 2022-2023 school year, there will be a 25% reduction in the number of office disciplinary referrals resulting in in-school or out-of-school suspensions.

3-Talent Development Goals

3a.Our school will improve teacher retention during the 2022-2023 school year by 10% compared to the turnover rate during the 2021-2022 school year.
