need C average in Math 1, 2, 3
OR ACT Math score of 19 or SLCC Math test
College Algebra (MATH 1050)-Testing Prerequisite-
need C average in Math 1,2,3
AND ACT Math score of 23, ACT Reading score of 18
Trigonometry (MATH 1060)-Testing Prerequisite-
must pass Math 1050 with a C
Chinese Immersion Classes through the Bridge Program
Requires teacher approval and passing AP test

Students may NOT be dropped from any of the AP or CE courses until the following items have been completed:

- Parent/Guardian contact with the principal
 - We want parents/guardians to know their student would like to drop the course.
 - Parent/Guardian must give approval.
- If AP course:
 - Discuss testing fees with parent and student.
- If Concurrent Enrollment course:
 - **No refunds** for college admissions or course registration.
 - Student **MUST** drop class with the college. If they have questions, they can call or come into the Career Center for help.
 - After the drop date set by the college, the student will not be able to drop the class but will instead have to withdraw, resulting in a W on their transcript.
 - After the withdrawal date set by the college, the student will not be able to withdraw from the college course. They will end up with a fail on their college transcript.
 - W's and F's on college transcripts could have an impact on a student's eligibility to receive financial aid.
 - Students who graduate early will not be able to drop the college course. In order to get the college credit, they must finish the course at the high school.
