

SLCC PACE at Cottonwood High School: 2023-2024


Mission:

Students who complete our four-year high school program earn an up to six-semester scholarship to SLCC.

SLCC and Cottonwood High School partnered to launch the PACE program in 2015. We have since graduated four senior classes, totaling 95 high school graduates! We currently serve 74 high school students.






