## Meeting Minutes

## Agenda Items:

1. 9-12 Reconfiguration:
  - a. Kris Nguyen introduced visiting Brockbank and Matheson Community Council members and provided an overview of where the council is in the steps to move forward on reconfiguration evaluation. Other community councils were invited to attend to create a common goal to get information to the community so that they can make an educated decision. Cyprus, Brockbank, and Matheson must all vote for a survey through their community councils in order to move forward. Ronda Bachelor reported that the Brockbank Community Council has voted for the survey. Emily Pope from Matheson indicated that their council would be voting next week. Gary Pope made a motion seconded by Starling Lock for Cyprus to vote at the regularly scheduled January meeting.
  - b. If all three councils vote for a survey, Granite District will have an independent team complete the survey. It is expected the survey would go out around Parent/Teacher Conferences in February. June 1st is the anticipated date for a community vote. On June 30th Granite School District Administration will make a recommendation.
  - c. Emily Pope from Matheson shared that Matheson would not be proposing an independent reconfiguration plan. The District has available on their website a study and report regarding the results of Granger High School moving to a 9-12 reconfiguration. Arlene Bryce provided an overview Brockbank Community Council's feasibility review and study of the number of students affected by this plan. She reported that based on numbers it is not logistically possible to just move 9<sup>th</sup> grade to Cyprus. Mr. McDaniel reported that next year 4-5 relocatable classrooms will be needed to house the students 10-12 grade.

2. Budget Questions and Answers: Mr. McDaniel confirmed that last year's final budget report was received by council members through email and provided an overview of the budget process and uses. Examples of various models of making teachers more available for mentoring during the school day were introduced. Next year's budget proposal will be made in March or April.
3. Training.
