### Cyprus High 2021-2022 Continual Improvement Plan

What strengths and areas for improvement stood out while reviewing student levels of achievement?

Cyprus has seen successes in growth in the advancement of opportunities for students to take Advanced Placement and Concurrent Enrollment courses. We have also seen growth in Reading Inventory proficiency over the past four years. Finally, we have had successes on the WIDA test, as we have focused on support for our multi-language learners.

On the other end, Cyprus has seen an overall decrease in graduation rates over the past four years. Our percentage of students scoring 18+ on the ACT is still relatively low at 43%. Our levels of proficiency on state assessment have not been to a level of acceptance. This year, we have seen a dramatic decrease in students passing classes.

Cyprus continues to see performance gaps between our diverse and low socio-economic populations. While efforts are seeing successes in taking courses, there is still work to be done on course completion and exam success. Equal Opportunity Schools and AVID are key programs in helping us to target these successes.

As a whole, our tenth grade struggles with success rates (grades) more than other grades, but this COVID year has seen a major decline by all grades in this measurement of student success. While our Freshman class has its struggles, our Freshman Academy has created more opportunities for success for our ninth grade students. AVID has also benefited our students discovering their pathway to college.

In all, our observations are that we will see more successes and be better equipped to address our challenges as we move to become an AVID site school. In addition, providing more teacher instructional support will equip them with the skills needed to support our diverse population. Finally, we have a great educational staff that has the ability to target our deficit and help create a system that supports student success.
