SSAP and Land Trust Final Report

SSAP stands for School/Student Achievement Plan.

Assessment is currently CRT data. The test will change to SAGE. This will be the first year we see how (or if) the results are able to correlate.

The school's goals are to increase Achievement for Every Student.

For Language Arts DIBELS Next Benchmark Assessment will increase based on established District Goals.

For Mathematics the Acuity Progress Screener will increase to 65% of the students in Tier 3-4 by the end of the year.

These goals are on the bottom of every SCC Agenda.

The Land Trust Final Report was presented and approved. Land Trust funds have increased because of good management by the State. This will mean the school can hire more aides to help with our scholastic goals. This is the main way the SCC spends our land trust money because have scores showing that the increase of aides has improved our test scores.

Our Land Trust Goals for the year are to have DIBELS scores in both grades K-3 and 4-6 increase by 3% and have an average of 50% of our students score in Tier 4 on each Acuity Benchmark Posttest throughout the school year.
