## CONSEQUENCES FOR NOT FOLLOWING EXPECTATIONS

After verbal or other warning has been given, and the behavior continues, the teacher will:

Step One: Give student a "Stop and Think." Student goes to a time out area for 5 minutes.

Step Two: If the behavior continues, the teacher will repeat step one, and the student will

return to the time out area for another 5 minutes.

Step Three: If the behavior continues, the teacher will direct the student, "Stop and Go."

The student will be given a note and will go to a pre-arranged classroom for 15 minutes (grades K - 3) or 30 minutes (grades 4 - 6). The student will bring home a "Stop and Go" note to be signed by the parents and returned the following day.

Please be supportive by signing and returning the form the next day. If the note is not returned with the parent's signature, the parent will be contacted by the teacher.

Step Four: If the student has 3 "Stop and Go" infractions in one week, a conference may be scheduled with the student, parent, and school personnel to discuss a plan to help correct the inappropriate behavior.

Serious behaviors that endanger students and adults will be handled according to the Granite District Safe School Policy and may result in suspension.
