Review of Community Council Handbook – Discussed the importance of community council and how it oversees LAND Trust funds.

Review of Farnsworth’s School Grade: Discussed Farnsworth’s letter grade of “D”. Can be found at utahschoolgrades.schools.utah.gov

- Areas of Growth: ‘Developing’ proficiency – ELA 18.2%, Math 24.1%, Science 27.3%, ‘Critical’ in ELL Adequate Progress 29.6% and ELL Reaching Proficiency 4.2%
- Areas of progress: ‘Commendable’ growth – ELA 49.9%, Math 61.6%, Science 59.5%, Growth of Lowest 25% 47.6%

Continual Improvement Plan goals:

1-Academic Learning Goals
1a. At least 65% of students will reach typical or above typical progress on the End of Year Acadience Reading assessment.
1b. At least 75% of students will reach typical or above typical progress on the End of Year Acadience Math assessment.
1c. Based on the 2023 WIDA Access Exam, 35% of students will meet their WIDA Growth Target. ELL proficiency will be evaluated throughout the year during PLC collaboration tracking learning progressions.
2-Social Skills and Dispositions Goals
2a. At the end of the 2022-2023 school year, there will be a 5% reduction in the number of students identified as being chronically absent (missing 10% or more of the required school days or class periods) compared to the number of students identified as being chronically absent during the 2021-2022 school year.

2b. At the end of the 2022-2023 school year, there will be 100% of teachers documenting behaviors through Educator's Handbook following the PBIS decision tree.

3-Talent Development Goals

3a. By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, 100% of PLCs will meet at least 8 times per month with an established agenda, reviewing student performance based on core standards, and have the PLC engage in a data protocol to determine reteaching.
