FIRST IMPRESSIONS

We hope all of you have a nice Spring Break. This month we will be working very hard so that we will be ready for the second grade.

In reading, we have just finished up the unit on "I think I can". We read stories about Frog and Toad and their kite, which taught us to not give up, but to try again. We also read the story about "The Little Engine that Could". This story taught us that if we think we can do something and we try real

hard at it, we will be able to accomplish it. We should still be reading each night for 20 minutes and recording it on our Road to Success chart. All students that have read the average of 4 times a week, will be invited to a fun activity at the end of the year.




