## FIRST IMPRESSIONS

In first grade we have been working really
 hard in math with telling time! Now that we have finished that test, we are moving on to different types of graphs! We are looking at picture graphs, bar graphs, tally charts, etc. and answering questions based off of the data in the graphs. After that we will be working with geometry and learning all about shapes. In reading we have been and will continue to read lots of stories about plants! We will
be learning all about plants and how they grow and what they are used for. We have so much fun in first grade! Remember to keep filling out your reading logs and turning in your homework every night so we can remember all the fun things we learned earlier in the day.

## SECOND THOUGHTS

It has been a super measurement month in 2nd grade! First, we reviewed the English standard measures of inch, foot, yard, and mile. Next, we studied the metric measurement of millimeter, centimeter, meter, and kilometer. We enjoyed drawing the silhouettes of birds at the art truck (to put up on windows) to protect birds in our neighborhood. The Art Show was a big success, with our classes show-
ing our selected art from the past year, and the choir did a great job with their singing! Second grade will be hosting a community specialist who will talk to us about all the services that our community provides for everyone. We hope that a police officer will visit the classrooms, and the safety rules for bicycles and to always keep your eyes alert for cars and other riders.

## THIRD DEGREE

In third grade we are currently studying the life cycle of a butterfly. The students have been observing our live caterpillars move through the stages of life. They arrived in the caterpillar, or the larva stage, and the students have enjoyed watching them weave their bridges and ladders, form the J shape, and create chrysalis. It's fun to have a hands-on experience with the wonders of nature!

In math, we are finishing up our measurement unit which includes telling time to the minute and elapsed time, which is how much time has passed or how much time until some-
thing happens. This is a difficult concept for many students so we encourage you to practice telling time at home. We are also starting to work with area and perimeter as well as 2-D shapes and angles.

SAGE testing has begun and we ask that students get plenty of sleep at night and eat a healthy breakfast in the morning. Remember that our cafeteria serves breakfast in the morning so please use those services if you find yourself in a hurry in the mornings.

Students will be taking 3 more SAGE tests total: language arts, math, and science. The language arts SAGE tests will begin the week of April 28th, and the remaining SAGE tests will be given at our assigned times until the week of May 19th. We will send notes home with your child letting you know what days your child will be taking
the SAGE test. Please make sure your students are present that day, had a good night's sleep, and eat a good breakfast. They are going to do great on their test!

We are currently in the unit "Dollars and Sense" in language arts. Students are reading stories about how to make wise money choices.

Currently in science, we have been discussing Utah Environments. Ask your child about the different types of environments in Utah and all the wonderful plants and animals that live there. We are also discussing endangered species in Utah.

In math, we are on our last
chapter of Go Math, which is focusing on area and perimeter. We will begin reviewing for the SAGE test after this chapter is finished.
