Second Grade-

Second Grade has gone through some changes this year. We would like to welcome Mrs. Chamberlain and Mrs. Rollings to Robert Frost Elementary. Mrs. Unsworth is teaching a 2nd/1st grade split. We are excited to have these three working with our 2nd grade students.

In second grade, we have been busy reviewing everything we learned in first grade and expanding our knowledge. In language arts, we have read many wonderful stories. Now that we have all the basic sounds, we are working on our fluency. Remember that reading each night for 20 minutes is very important. In math, we are learning how to add and subtract making a 10. This is a great strategy to help us do our math facts quickly.

We would like to thank all the parents that helped the PTA with their fundraiser. Congratulations to Mrs. Rollings' class for earning a field trip. All three classes earned and enjoyed a movie and popcorn. We would like to thank the volunteers that made our Halloween celebration so much fun.

Third Grade-

THIRD GRADE IS GREAT!! In language arts, we have learned the parts of speech and used that to focus on complete sentences. We are now taking those sentences to write narrative and informational paragraphs (remember to ask your kids about "The Hand is the Plan"!). Students continued to make gains in our reading fluency and comprehension. Our focus on different comprehension strategies and taking notes is proving successful.

Math is multiplying (pun intended) our skills! After rounding and learning those add and subtract key words, we are starting our mastery of multiplication, and the variety of ways to solve, students are recognizing that they can divide at the same time.

In science, we are focusing on living and non -living, and the characteristics of each. In addition, animals and their habitats are next up. All 3rd graders are starting their first reports of the year— Animal Reports!

CBTU-

CBTU has had a great start to the new school year! We decided as a class to improve our writing and relationship skills by writing to Pen Pals at Academy Park and Sandburg Elementary schools. So far we have written them and received letters back—it's been pretty exciting! We plan to have a field trip to meet our Pen Pals later on in the year.

We have talked about the importance of social skills in our lives and how they help us every day! Just a few we have learned about are: Getting Along, Waiting, Respect, and Interrupting Appropriately. We are practicing them and getting better each day!



Fourth Grade-

Hello fourth graders and families! The beginning of the year has been fun as we have discussed risks and consequences through literature, rocks and minerals in science, and using place value in mathematics. As we move forward, we strive to master our times tables and develop our reading and writing skills. We are becoming scientists through inquiry-based learning. The Natural History Museum of Utah has helped us use those skills. We were able to work with real fossils to practice inferencing, predicting, inquiring and recording. We look forward to the knowledge we will receive from the Loveland Living Planet Aquarium.

Fifth Grade-

It has been a wonderful beginning to a new school year. We are so excited about the fun things we have in store for this school year.

This month we have been studying heredity and explorers. We are becoming experts on this. Ask your student more about heredity and how traits are passed on to their young. In math, we are working on multiplication, division, place value, and word problems.

We had SEP's this past month. It was so good to see everyone who was able to make it out. We were able to make some goals for the school year. If you were not able to make it or need to talk to your student's teacher, please call the school and we will be more than happy to schedule you an appointment.

Remember, your child has homework EVERY night. They should be working on their spelling words, reading at least 20 minutes each night, and any work they didn't finish in class. If your child doesn't have their multiplication facts memorized, they need to be memorizing them so they can recall them immediately. Basic facts are crucial for success in 5th grade. Also, please make sure you are signing their planner and reading minutes every night too!





Sixth Grade-

So far this year in the 6th grade, we have been learning about Ancient Civilizations, which include Ancient Rome, Egypt, Greece, and Mesopotamia. The students have made Power Points and models to show what they have learned.

In math, we have been learning about graphs, ordered pairs, integers, and ratios. In language arts, we have read stories about Martin Luther King, Cesar Chavez, and other courageous people of our time.
