- ✓ Grades are based **ONLY** on **academic performance**.
- ✓ Assessments of academic performance come in many forms.
- ✓ Students can retake assessments to show increased understanding/proficiency.
- ✓ Class activities and homework are used to let students practice concepts.
- ✓ Students and parents can check progress weekly on Gradebook.

Academic grades should **only** communicate progress toward proficiency in course standards. They should not be affected by behavioral issues or extra credit. Granite School District's **Proficiency-Based Grading (PBG)** model is centered on this premise.
