Criminal Law (CJ 1330) taken with Careers in Law Enforcement (CJ 2540)

This program is a college level introduction to our criminal justice system where students interested in pursuing a career in all aspects of criminal justice, criminology and the law can learn more about these subjects. This program is taught in conjunction with Salt Lake Community College (SLCC) and uses the same curriculum taught at SLCC. Motivated students can enroll concurrently in SLCC and receive up to 12 credit hours over two semesters. It is recommended that students take the Criminal Justice and Corrections block first and then the Criminal Law and Careers later, however, this is not mandatory.
