## Humanities 1100: INTRO TO HUMANITIES (HU)

This course is all about exploring the questions humans keep coming back to in one form or another. We discuss themes of beauty, creativity, identity, good and evil, happiness, and what makes life meaningful. Ultimately, we discuss what it means to be human. We look at how the arts, historical and current events, and philosophy reflect responses to these questions.

## Sociology 1010: INTRODUCTION TO SOCIOLOGY (SS)

Sociology attempts to uncover aspects of the social world that we tend to take for granted. It does this by focusing on how the structure of social relations and institutions influences members of society. Sociologists focus on social context and social structures that shape individual behavior. This curriculum is designed to give you a broad overview of the primary themes and topics within the discipline of sociology, as well as help you develop specific skills in scientific reasoning such as critical thinking and writing. Students will gain substantive knowledge in the effects of social problems upon individuals, groups, families, organizations, community, nation, and the world at large.
