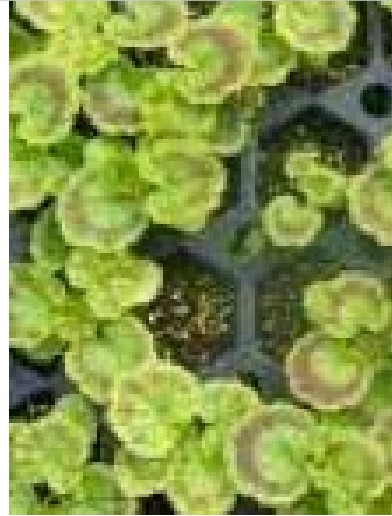


Plant and Soil Science
