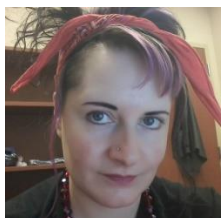

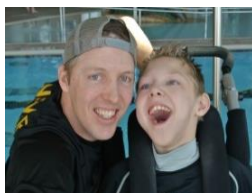
This will be an interactive session about transition into adult health care and related services, the supports and resources available and the opportunity to meet others that are going through a similar experience.
