RESOURCE SPOTLIGHT



Each month we spotlight a resource or agency in the community that provides assistance to families with children with special needs. This month we spotlight the Utah Department of Health and Human Services for People with Disabilities.

DSPD has intake workers on staff whose primary responsibility is to work with you to determine if you or your loved one is eligible for services. To apply call 1-844-275-3773 and choose the "Apply for Services" option to speak with an intake worker.

During the intake process, you will be asked to provide information to the Division which demonstrates your qualifying disability in one of the areas that DSPD serves. That information may include: Copy of Basic identifying information such as name, phone number, address, social security number, Psychological evaluations, or for children under six years of age, a developmental assessment, School evaluations, Medical health summaries, Other documentation unique to your disability

A great deal of information is necessary to determine eligibility and to identify needed services, so it is helpful to start the process as early as possible.

You have 90 days to complete the intake process. If you are unable to complete the intake process within those 90 days, you will be placed on inactive status. You may continue your application at any time and are not penalized whatsoever when you are place on inactive status. If at any time you wish to continue the intake process, an intake worker will be more than happy to assist you.

Once you have been determined eligible for DSPD services, an intake worker will assess the individual's need.

The Needs Assessment tool establishes a "needs" score, which indicates the level or severity of need for services. This score is generally based on: 1) urgency of need, 2) severity of the applicant's disability, 3) parental caregiver's ability, and 4) length of time on the waiting list. This determines the rank on the waiting list. The Division is not usually able to offer immediate services to eligible people due to funding constraints, which are allocated by the Utah State Legislature. Once placed on the waiting list, the person will wait until there are sufficient funds to bring them off and into services or their needs change. As funds become available, individuals on the waiting list are notified by a DSPD intake worker and brought into services.
