Hillside School Community Council Minutes December 7, 2020

In attendance: Dr. Pauline Longberg (Principal), Cindy Davis, Karen Bates, Becky Parker, Sydney Graybill, Joey Loveridge, Autumn Jeppson, Marie Porter, Sarah Geertsen, Jaime Hillier, and Erika Castro.

Visitor: Sabrina Felsted (Vice Principal), Jessica Martinez (Family Center), Jodi Lusty, Jadee Talbot, Brianna Randall, and Josh Randall.

Meeting was called to order at 5:02 by Karen Bates. Looked over minutes from November's meeting. Cindy Davis motioned to approve the minutes for the month of November, it was seconded by Sydney Graybill, and was unanimously approved by the SCC committee.

Dr. Longberg shared the budget with the council. The Land Trust budget began with a budget of \$85,794.94. Currently, as of December 4, we have \$43,364.18 in the Land Trust

budget. The TSSA budget began with a budget of \$89,910.06. Currently as of December 4 we have \$86,392.71 in the TSSA budget. We are on track with the plan to deplete the Land Trust budget and transition to TSSA budget by mid-February.

The **SSAP** was reviewed and approved by the academic team. Dr. Longberg submitted the plan.

LITERACY--60% of students will make typical or above growth from beginning to end of year according to DIBELS Pathways of Progress (POP). In addition, by May 2021 we will increase the percentage of students achieving proficiency on RISE Language Arts by a minimum of 10 percentage points over the percentages achieved in Spring, 2021

NUMERACY—By May 2021 we will increase the percentage of students achieving proficiency on RISE Mathematics by a minimum of 10 percentage points over the percentages achieved in Spring, 2021.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT--100% of teachers will have a web-presence that is information-based and up-to-date. 100% of parents will participate in each SEP conference either in person/ZOOM or through email or phone. Complete at least 150 home visits school wide prior to May, 2021.

Dr. Longberg introduced Jadee Talbot and Jodi Lusty who work at the district and focus on family engagement. Jadee talked about the importance of family engagement and being able to improve partnerships between families and educators. Jodi Lusty added the next step to partnering is to do focus groups with families. The plan is to reach out to a variety of families and interview them to get a feel for how their experience has been with Hillside. Each grade level has come up with the most essential math priorities for their students to know before leaving their current grade. Jodi has helped put together a poster and 3x5 cards with the priorities on them. There are enough 3x5 cards to send home with each student so families know what the top priorities are and how to best help their students succeed and reach those goals.

A video was made showing safe ways to drop off and pick up students at Hillside. The video is not a finished product and changes can be made to it. It was suggested to mention in the video that it is okay to park at the church parking lot and have students walk to them so there isn't as much traffic in Hillside's parking lot. Another item that needs to be added to the video is anyone that gets out of their car must use a crosswalk. Cindy Davis said she will find a PDF of the parking lot showing the route and which direction to go. U turns are illegal on 6000 W during school hours. Dr. Longberg has assigned an adult to guide traffic as cars go through the "W" There are enough safety patrol members out before and after school.

Teachers mentioned there is not enough time to celebrate the holiday this year. Parents felt okay with that and that parents would understand. The lunch room plays Christmas music at lunch while the students eat. There has also been a Christmas tree set up in the lunchroom.

Marie Porter asked if there was anyway to help the teachers who are doing dual modalities? Dr. Longberg mentioned that parents sticking with what they have committed to for that term really helps.

Parents are very happy with the procedures and cleanliness of the school during Covid 19.
