- 2. Principal Time—(15 min)
 - a. Land Trust/TSSA budget report

Land Trust remaining balance of 15, 022.21 TSSA remaining balance of 78,128.19

b. Staffing plan

19.5 FTE1.5 teachers in Kindergarten and 3 teachers per grade level 1-6 grade2 full time Special Education Teachers532 students projected enrollment for 2021-22 school year

3. Next Year's Land Trust Plan—(20 min)

2021-22 Budgets:

Land Trust: \$68,371 ESSER II: \$63, 456 TSSA: \$34,000 ALP: \$5,000 Suggested to use funds for paraprofessionals for intervention and extension of student learning and technology support in February's Community Council meeting.

- a. Teacher Input:
 - Full time teacher who serves as an intervention specialist.
- b. Community Input:
 - 2020-21 year started with a carry over from the TSSA budget from 2019-20.
 - All grade levels will have additional support due to the dissolving of distance learning program.
 - Use Land Trust for paraprofessional and technology
 - ESSER and TSSA money to keep FTE and hire a certified teacher as an intervention specialist.
- c. Principal Input:
 - Divide ELA and Math Flex groups into smaller groups for intervention or extension. Possibly have 2 certified teachers serve as intervention specialists.
 - Recommendation to use Land Trust for paraprofessionals and technology.
- 4. Community Comment Time—(20 min)
 - a. Focus groups
 - 92% of positive interactions with the front office
 - Communication was positive of Class Dojo
 - Meeting preferences of virtual and in-person
 - Majority were positive about what their child is learning.
 - Connecting with teachers with email, gradebook, Dojo
 - Proficiency Based Grading is a challenge and parents would appreciate additional training or information on how their child is being graded.
 - Language Barrier is an issue of parent participation.
 - Suggested from parents:
 - i. Voice opinions from parents.
 - ii. Variety of SEP conferences being in-person or virtual.
 - iii. Gifted program in place at the school
 - iv. More interpreters
 - v. Early start time and provide care options for children afterschool

- vi. Longer eating time for students in the lunchroom
- vii. Focus groups will continue to get more input.
- b. End of year celebrations/promotions
 - Promotion for 6th grade: 6th grade team find out what the parents would like. Limit the number of people who can attend for the promotion. Focus on promotion to Jr. High.
 - Kindergarten celebration: Kindergarten program with songs, and a completion of kindergarten certificate.
 - Year end celebration: Field Day will occur with limitation of 25% of capacity.
