Mr. Stauffer put forth the idea of using Land Trust monies to hire a teaching coach to assist new or struggling teachers with learning and practicing good teaching skills to improve teaching and teacher retention. It would be a bit of a gamble because he would need to hire now and that could impact our budget if student numbers drop to the point that we lose an FTE come October. Members of the Council agreed that it is worth the gamble and encouraged him to move forward with the idea over the next few weeks.
