

Hunter High School Community Council Meeting Minutes

Minutes from April 15, 2019 The Art Printing press in proposal 1 will not be delivered in time to come on this year's budget so \$5,210.00 was added to proposal 10 for additional cameras. The Science glassware washer request was denied because it does not fit the requirements (it is classified as equipment.) \$10,218.94 has been returned to the budget. Minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business:

1. Community Council Elections: Notifications began May 14. Elections will be held on-line September 17, 18, and 19. Intention of candidacy forms are due to the Principal's office by August 29, 2019. Angela, Esther, Laura and Brenda are at the end of their terms, so there will be four open parent seats. Because of the number of missed meetings, per the "HHS Community Council Rules and Procedures" that were approved at the September 2018 HHS CC meeting, Jeff Grossaint will be asked to resign his seat and a parent replacement will be appointed to finish out the second year of the term. Cindy Davis will notify Mr. Grossaint of this action.
2. Department Chair Payments-reports were shared with the Council stating the responsibilities that have been performed throughout the year
3. Afterschool Labs Payments-reports were presented to the Council showing attendance and activities at the after-school labs
4. Craig Stauffer: Explained the legislative action that is bringing \$275,000 to Hunter High School from the TSSA. He outlined his TSSA Plan for 2019-2020
Proposal—Increase proficiency and Growth scores for students: \$145,000 in extra periods to reduce class size. \$80,000 for an additional instructional coach. Increase the WIDA scores: \$50,000 in ESL aids working with students in English, Math and Science.
Esther Olschewski suggested that there be some sort of activity or learning opportunity for Seniors and other interested students who are needing to learn how to write a resume, apply for and interview for a job as part of their preparation for real-world experiences.
