

Hunter High Community Council Meeting Minutes

Community Council called to order at 4:32 pm by Cindy Davis

Attendance

- Seconded by Roxanne Ohran

New Business:

- Tardies -- Offering a free ticket to Winter Ball (Dec. 11) for students with perfect attendance/no tardies.
 - Students with excused absences will qualify for this incentive.
 - Council requested data regarding which grade has the most tardies; which period (other than 1st) has the most tardies
- Concerns about various crosswalks around the campus area.
 - SRO has been stationed in crosswalk in front of the school before and after school.
 - Council asked about having lights installed in the back parking lot so drivers can better see students crossing.
- Adam's Family is opening this week. Performances are Nov. 18-20, 22 with a matinee on the 20th.
- Winter sports have started. This includes swim, basketball, and wrestling.
 - Full capacity.
 - Mask use encouraged.
 - Tickets purchased online for \$6.
 - Convenience fee on tickets is covered by the school.
- Ryan Oaks asked the Community Council to consider funding PLC conference June 8-10 in Las Vegas.
 - Conference administered by Solution Tree//DuFore
 - All high schools in Granite are considering attending.
 - Ryan would like to offer the opportunity to all faculty members (103 teachers).
 - This conference will allow the faculty to take PLCs to the next level.
 - Administered by the DuFour
 - Build and maintain high-functioning teams.

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- Focus on data analysis.
- Learn interventions and extensions.
- Estimate about \$2k per participant (registration fee, flight, hotel).
- Council's concerns --
 - Will there be enough funding to cover other typical expenditures such as Literary magazine, AP Exams, AVID, field trips, etc.
 - Ryan assured the council that this conference would not override other funding requests
 - Can Trustland's money be used for this type of conference?
 - Council discussed this and determined that effective PLCs are directly correlated to student achievement.
- Council gave tentative approval and requested more specific information such as the cost of registration and how many teachers would choose to go.
- Esther Olschewski wanted to discuss the possibility of HHS hosting a career fair. She feels it would be a good way to unite the school and community. It would also give students the opportunity to learn about other available options in addition to a traditional 4-year university. The council then discussed it.
 - Does not want to place a burden on teachers
 - Would like to use the school grounds - possibly the courtyard
 - Parents and other community members would host a booth/table with information about their job/career.
 - Ryan mentioned that GTI does something similar to this on their campus.
 - Maybe GTI can be invited as well?
 - Other options: include the PTA, FBLA, FCCLA, DECA, LIA, People of the Pacific
 - Roxanne mentioned that this fair could be used for citizenship makeup credit.
 - What would have the greatest impact -- one night with all the booths or multiple nights with less people, but more time for in-depth presentations?
