New Business:

- Wrapping up 3rd quarter
 - Starting credit recovery push for seniors. May 13 is the cutoff for new credit recovery packets. Fourth quarter credit recovery takes place during the summer.
 - Teachers/administrators will be addressing seniors' attendance in April: if students are not coming to class, phone calls/emails will be made.
 - Working with LIA for a cultural "good vibes only" night in May; will invite Hunter Learning Network.
 - New signage on Aux Gym – looks especially good at night.
 - Discussed best ways to communicate with parents – emails, phone calls, text messages, social media. Consensus is a combination of these methods.
- School Plan for 2022-2023
 - Minor change – add the word "and" to a section at the end
 - Motion to approve by Brenda Shamo; seconded by Esther Olschewski
 - Unanimous approval
- Amendment #2 - transfer of monies
 - Can only fund ½ the instructional coach, so encumbered money needed to be pulled and reallocated
 - Other funding was moved to different categories to support the proposal of the PLC conference for which 55 teachers have committed

- Textbooks for AP Human Geography
 - \$19,371.53. Will provide enough textbooks to registered students plus a classroom set
 - College Board has changed the course standards. Students need access to textbooks, not only online materials
 - Motion to approve by Esther Olschewski; seconded by Julianne Hamblin
 - Unanimous approval
- Professional Development summer PLC Conference
 - \$108,289.14. 55 teachers have have committed to attend (more than any other high school in the district)
 - Motion to approve by Jennifer Johnson; seconded by Lissa Woolf.
 - Unanimous approval
- Technology - Laptops for Debate Class
 - \$14, 505.15. Laptops are 5+ years old. Students' evidence is no longer paper-based, it is all digital. Students need better technology to access online debates and forums which are the preferred method now rather than in-person debates.
 - Motion to approve by Brenda Shamo; seconded by Jennifer Johnson
 - Unanimous approval
- Technology - Computers to update Art Computer Lab
 - \$30,001.60. Mac Lab is out of date. District does not support Macs at this time. The lab will be updated with PCs. Part of funding may be procured by the Textology fund. The ability to do this is time sensitive, so this may come up at a later date for additional approval.
 - Motion to approve by Julianne Hamblin; seconded by Brenda Shamo
 - Unanimous approval
