

Hunter High Community Council Meeting Minutes

Minutes from March 2021 were approved unanimously.

New Business:

1. Ryan Oaks: Graduation will be held at USANA amphitheater. There are 7000 seats for the graduates and some of the families. The rest of the families will be seated on the lawn which will hold up to 13,000 people. Graduation will be held June 3rd at 4pm.
 - a. The ongoing improvement plan consolidates several plans. The Land Trust is part of a larger plan. The amount for that the 2021-22 school year will be \$321,805. An additional \$163,811 will come from the Teacher and Student Success Act (TSSA), with another \$362,000 from the Elementary and Secondary Student Emergency Relief (ESSR) federal grant expected every year for 2 years, up to 4 years. The ESSR is to be spent making up the educational gaps created or worsened by covid. This could be spent to lower class sizes in English and math. Money can be sent to hire personnel on one-time only basis, or to pay current personnel to add more periods.

An idea was presented to create math classes for students who failed this previous year, and help tutor them to catch up. There will also be summer school options where students can take classes by paying a flat rate and taking as many credits as they want, sort of like an "All you can eat credit buffet."
2. The final report is submitted. The graduation rate dropped, there was an increase of number of credit recovered. The ACT and ACT Aspire numbers were not included in the report, but AP scores were up. Enrollment dropped, Math and English Honors enrollment was up, while Social Studies Honors numbers dropped.
