New Business

Ryan Oaks - Graduation rate has increased to 85%. This is above average for the state and for the district. At the end of 1st quarter we had a reward for all of the students who had a 3.0 or higher. Over 900 students were able to be a part of that. Granite School District is looking to implement some kind of metal detection system. They would like Hunter High school to pilot that program. The goal is to make the school safer with the least amount of interruption. Security would be done through a third party. Admin would be available for this as well. There are several areas that need to be evaluated and processed to make this go as smoothly as possible. Before trying to implement anything we will provide information about this in our meeting in January. There is a task force that will be involved in planning. More information is to come on this in January.

Maria Garcia - Does Hunter High have mental health resources for students. We have a Social Worker, Psychologist, School Counselors, and a Food Pantry.

Esther Olschewski - There is a resource called Parents Empowered - This is an additional resource. This is helpful for reducing some of the difficulties associated with underaged drinking, vaping, and more. We are wondering if this could be something presented to the community? Some of the ideas suggested are to have the group attend parent-teacher-conference, Hunter parent night, and 9th grade orientation.

Esther Olschewski - Parent was concerned about a teacher that gave an assignment that was to be done over the break. Mr. Oaks will speak with that teacher about the issue. Brenda also was concerned about a particular book that the English class was reading

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and wanted to know what to do about it. Suggestions were shared—specifically to reach out to the teacher.

Proposals

Fitness for Life textbooks - Fitness for Life Physical Education (Emily Walters \$4,810).
