Senior Message about Graduation

Seniors,

Caps and Gowns are now with your counselor if you were unable to pick it up on April 30, 2024. Please make sure you have completed all requirements and are passing any class needed for graduation before you pick up your cap and gown. It is also important to clear any fees at the accounting window.

For graduation, please plan to arrive an hour early. Patrons will be directed to their seats and graduates will be directed to the waiting area. Graduates must pick up a name card and write their name phonetically. They will hold onto this card and then hand it to the reader before walking across the stage.

Graduates, remember that you cannot decorate your caps. Please be conservative with leis as too many can reduce your visibility and be a potential hazard as you walk across the stage.

After you are dismissed from the graduation ceremony, you will return your gown to Jostens and then you will be able to pick up your diploma from your counselor.

As Mr. Oaks always says, keep graduation classy. Do not make a spectacle of yourself. If students behave in any manner that is offensive or draws unwanted attention, we will hold onto your diploma until you have met with administration. The same is true of patrons. Please do not bring any confetti cannons or noise makers that will be a distraction or create a mess.
