## Stuff You Need to Know...

#### **Building Hours**

Before school until 7:30, students are only allowed to be in the commons area unless they are with a teacher. Students must exit the building by 3:00 p.m., unless they are under the direct supervision of an adult employee.

#### Chromebooks, Textbooks, and other School Materials

Students are expected to handle their Chromebooks, books and other provided material to avoid damage. Fines will be issued for stolen, lost, abused, or misused books or other materials provided by the school. **The cost to replace a Chromebook is \$180.00** 

#### Lost & Found

All lost and found items are taken to the Counseling Center. Put your name on your belongings in case you lose them!

#### Lunch

Lunch is served in the cafeteria daily. The cost for lunch is \$1.65 per day. Application forms for free and reduced lunches are available online at www.applyforlunch.com. Students may be in the commons and the east courtyard during lunch. Please make sure that you are in the appropriate area by the time the tardy bell rings.

#### Excusing Absences

If you miss school, return with an excusal note which includes your name, grade, dates of absence and parent/guardian signature. Take the note to the Counseling Center. Be sure to check your weekly attendance summary on the Granite School District website (http://www.graniteschools.org/) to make sure the absence has been excused.

#### Buses

Buses are for those of you who live two or more miles from the school. The bus is for your convenience. The driver is in charge and must have full cooperation from you. If you abuse the privilege of riding the bus or have behaviors that endanger the safety of your fellow students, you will have your bus privilege revoked. #### Dress Code

The public school is a place of learning. Proper dress sets the tone of the school atmosphere. The Hunter Jr. High dress code stipulates:

- Appearance should not disrupt classroom activity and/or hinder fellow students' participation in class.
- Any messages or images that promote gangs, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex or are inappropriate will not be allowed.
- Clothing depicting disrespect towards any race, culture, religion or gender may NOT be worn.

- No shirts or clothing depicting vulgarity, profanity, criminal activity or violence such as pictures of weapons or violent actions.
- Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times. Pajamas and house slippers are NOT permitted.
- Standards of decency and propriety dictate that outer clothing should NOT be revealing of underwear.
- All clothing shorts and skirts need to be no higher than mid-thigh. Shorter clothing will require wearing leggings, opaque (non-see-through) tights or dance pants.
- All tops worn must cover the naval, shoulders & waist, and must not be low cut. Muscle T's, halters, midriffs & tank tops are NOT permitted.
- Hats of any kind (beanies, baseball caps, bandanas, scarves, visors, etc.) are NOT to be worn.
- Sunglasses are only worn outside.
- No chains of any kind are allowed.
- Belts must be completely tucked in.
- Hoodies are allowed to be worn but the student is not permitted to wear the hood.

\*\*The administration reserves the right to modify the Dress Code as needed to ensure the safety of all students.

#### Citizenship Counts!

Citizenship is determined by behavior, attendance, punctuality and adherence to the rules and policies of our school. Citizenship is affected by absences and tardies. A student with one unexcused absence can receive no higher than a "1". Two unexcused absences will result in a "0".

Citizenship is used to determine eligibility to participate in certain activities. If you want to participate in extracurricular athletics, you must maintain a 2.0 citizenship average. If you want to run for class office or be involved in the student government, you must maintain a 3.0 citizenship average.

#### Tardy Policy

You have 5 minutes to get from class to class. If you are tardy to class, disciplinary action will be taken. Rewards are also given to students with no tardies. **Students arriving late to school should bring a parent excusal note to avoid tardy consequences.** \* Additional consequences may be added as needed.

#### Personal Items

Items which may detract from the educational process or may present a hazard to others are not to be brought to school. Items confiscated by teachers or administrators will be returned to your parent/guardian only at the discretion of the administration. **The school will assume no liability for any item lost or stolen.** 

- Items such as weapons, slingshots or other projectile devices or facsimile will be referred to law enforcement officials.
- Other items such as cigarette lighters, matches, laser pens, fireworks, elastic bands, water toys and guns, or other similar things are not allowed at school.
- Personal items such as electronic games and gaming devices are prohibited.
- We discourage you from bringing any items of value to school such as collectible cards, irreplaceable photographs, large amounts of money, etc.

#### Cell Phones

While we recognize the importance of cell phones, and understand that many parents want their students to have cell phones at school, we restrict cell phone use at Hunter Junior High for these reasons:

- Cell phones create distractions to the learning environment when not strictly regulated.
- There are safety issues associated with cell phones such as cyber bullying and sexting.
- Cell phones are often lost, stolen, or damaged when used freely at school.

#### Rules for cell phones at Hunter Junior

- Phones must be put in a backpack or binder from our first bell at 7:40 a.m. until our final bell at 2:45 p.m. This includes lunch and passing times.
- Phones may only be used with permission from a teacher or other school official.
- Parents needing to contact their students are encouraged to call the school directly.
   We will get a message to the student and allow them to use their cell phone if necessary.
- Headphones and earbuds are not permitted from 7:40-2:45

#### Consequences for violating the Hunter Junior High cell phone policy

- First offense: Warning (teacher may take phone until the end of the period or school day).
- Second offense: Phone taken until the end of the class period and/or sent to office until end of the day.
- Third offense: Phone taken to office. Parent/guardian must pick phone up at school.
- Fourth offense: Overnight suspension/parent meeting. Student may not be allowed to bring a phone to school or be required to keep it in the office.

#### Registration Fees

(Fees are subject to change)

7<sup>th</sup> graders must pay a \$40 basic fee.

8th graders must pay a \$40 basic fee.

#### **Class Fees and other Fees**

Fees are collected in each class in which fees are required. Most elective classes require a fee as outlined in the 2022-2023 Junior High School Fee Schedule found in the Granite School District 2022-2023 Information for Junior & Senior High Students. Other than individual class fees, another optional cost is the Yearbook. The cost for this book is \$20.00 and students are encouraged to purchase this book during registration to make sure that they can have a book at the end of the school year.

### STUDENT EXPECTATIONS & STUDENT CONDUCT

### The Hawk Code of Conduct

The administration, staff and faculty, and peer leaders at Hunter Junior High are committed to creating a school atmosphere that strives for academic excellence and a safe environment for learning. We ask the support of students and parents to help us reach these goals and we have set the following code of standards which we expect the administration, staff and faculty, students, and visitors to Hunter Junior High to comply. Persons who choose not to comply with the Code of Standards also choose to accept appropriate disciplinary action.

Note: Student behavior on social media sites that violates the code of standards and disrupts the school's learning environment are also subject to disciplinary action by the administration.

#### **Code of Standards**

- Attendance to all classes each day is expected. Students are expected to be on time to all classes.
- All students have the right to attend school without being threatened or harassed. Verbal or physical threats or attacks, or any form of sexual harassment is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.
- Good citizenship is expected of everyone in all areas of the Hunter Junior High Campus.
- Students have the right to learn, and teachers have the right to teach. Behavior that interferes with this process is unacceptable.
- Students are expected to take binders with them to every class.

- Students will do their own best work and will not cheat. Cheating is copying of any type and/or communicating in any way to another student while a test is being given or about a test you will be taking.
- Foul or abusive language is not tolerated. Students are to treat others with respect and consideration.
- Students will not dress, speak or behave in ways which suggest or promotes gang affiliation.
- Fighting in or about the school building and from the time a student leaves home for school until he/she returns home is prohibited.
- Weapons or any objects or devices that might, or are intended to do harm to anyone, are prohibited. This includes lighters and matches.
- Possession use or distribution of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, e-cigarettes, imitation substances, or paraphernalia is prohibited. Students violating Granite District policy will be referred to juvenile authorities and will be subject to school and district disciplinary action.

The administration retains the right and privilege to issue penalties for acts not specifically stated herein and to alter any penalties considered necessary. Furthermore, the administration reserves the right to amend any provision in this disclosure which is in the best interest of the educational process.

#### Fighting, Threatening, Intimidating, Assault, & Battery

Fighting will not be tolerated at school, on the way to or from school, at any school function, or at school-sponsored activities. This will result in immediate parent contact and administrative action, which will include **suspension** from school and **possible referral to the police and district**. People who promote, instigate, or encourage fighting will also be deemed responsible and are subject to disciplinary actions. You may also be given a **\$50.00 fine** and/or required to take a "Safe Course" with your parent/guardian.

#### **Appropriate Language**

THE USE OF FOUL OR ABUSIVE LANGUAGE IS NOT PERMITTED IN THIS SCHOOL. Students will be given a consequence for the use of such language. Utah Law 53A-11-904 states: "Students who use foul, vulgar, profane or abusive language will be suspended from school." When such language is directed at a staff member the student will be suspended. Bad language shows a lack of respect for self and others and detracts from our school standards.

#### **Non-Discrimination Statement**

Granite School District prohibits discrimination, harassment (including sexual harassment), or retaliation on the basis of race, color, sex, pregnancy, religion, national origin, marital status, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or any other legally protected classification in all educational programs, activities, admissions, access, treatment, or employment practices and provides equal access to scouting groups and other designated groups. #### **Granite School District Alcohol and Other Drugs Policy**

The illegal use, possession, distribution, sale or being under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances, over-the counter prescription medications, or intoxicants of any kind by students is prohibited in all Granite School District schools, on school grounds, at school-sanctioned activities, or when students are being transported in vehicles dispatched by the district. Violations also include student use, possession, distribution or sale of drug paraphernalia, or imitation controlled substances.

#### A. Violations for Selling or Distributing Drugs/Alcohol

Students who are caught and/or convicted of selling or distributing controlled substances, imitation controlled substances or over-the-counter medications which alter students' psychological-social functioning and/or alcohol on the school grounds or within 1,000 feet of the school grounds, will be referred to law enforcement officials, suspended, and referred to the Granite School Student Services office for disciplinary action.

#### B. First Violation


- An automatic law enforcement referral will be made.
- There will be an automatic one to three-day suspension or until parent/guardian conference is held.
- The parent/guardian/student will read and sign the non-use contract with the designated administrator.
- The student will be assisted within the school (e.g., counseling, progress reports, etc.).
- The parent/guardian/student must attend and complete the Granite District QUIT program within two months of the violation. Failure to successfully complete the QUIT program will result in an automatic suspension to Student Services for placement in an alternative placement for up to 90 days.
- Free or low-cost family counseling and other district intervention services may be assessed.
- Students who are participants of extra-curricular activities or elected officers will be suspended from participation for two weeks.

#### C. Tobacco Use

The possession of tobacco or e-cigarettes for students under the age of 19 is against *Utah State law*. Violators in schools, at school activities or on school grounds will be issued citations by the school administration, which may include suspension and/or \$25 fine for the first offense and a \$50 fine for the 2<sup>nd</sup>/additional offenses. Fines may be waived for one offense if the student attends the district QUIT program with their parent/guardian.

The Granite School District "School Safety" policy establishes penalties and procedures for the following, including activities that take place on social media:

- Any threat or act of violence.
- Possession of any type of weapon (real, look-alike or pretend)
- Any form of organized gang activity.
- Any type of criminal behavior.
- Destruction or defacement of school property.
- Conduct in locations away from the school that threatens or does harm to the school or persons associated with the school.

Students who violate this policy may subject themselves to:

- Automatic suspension from school.
- Immediate referral to law enforcement officials.
- Mandatory parent/guardian conference at school or district offices.
- Referral to the district Student Services Office.
- Placement in an alternative program.
- Expulsion from school, or other action to resolve the problem
- A mandatory one-year expulsion may be imposed for any incident involving firearms.
