- 1. **Devices:** 80% of the classrooms have a Chromebook cart or enough Chromebooks for their students, 10% of the classrooms operate in a CTE computer lab, and the remaining 10% of classrooms have access to classroom size labs. One of these last 10% also has access to desktops in their classroom. We have 5 open desktops labs available to all teachers including the library which is open to all students before school, during lunch, and after school. All of our teachers have a mobile device to use in the classroom.
- 2. Applications: Chromebooks are used in the classroom by students to access all Granite School District programs for academic work, testing and other curriculum related resources or tools. Students are able to access Canvas and Gradebook to get work from teachers and see their academic progress. Google and Office 365 are used by students to prepare and share work with classmates and teachers. Students can also get to the online textbooks that departments utilize.
  - a. Math: GoMath, Canvas, Google Classroom, YouTube, SMART Notebook
  - b. Science: PHET Colorado, Google Classroom, CK12, Glencoe, YouTube
  - c. English: Google applications, Language Live, SMART Notebook
  - d. Social studies: Quizizz, Quizlet, YouTube
  - e. Health/PE: TeensHealth website
  - f. CTE: 3D modeling, photo editing, animation and programming applications, Office, coding websites
- 3. **Supervision:** Teachers walk around the room to see the applications and sites students are using for classwork. All teachers have the ability to monitor and limit/open websites and applications students use via a program called LanSchool. Our school also uses "allow" lists within LanSchool to direct students to sites that are being used by the teachers for instruction.
- 4. Inappropriate Information: All students and teachers must sign a computer usage agreement at the beginning of the year that lists all district rules and disciplinary actions. This may be done with a printed hardcopy or electronically on desktops. If a teacher sees inappropriate material on a student computer, they report it to the LMETS (Library Media and Educational Technology Specialist) or assistant principal for disciplinary action. All information is sent to the assistant principal where discipline is administered. All teacher, parent, and student computer activity are logged at a district level. Inappropriate information that appears for teachers or parents is reported to the principal and district personnel if needed. Students are encouraged to report inappropriate behavior to their teacher or administrators.
