She is awesome!

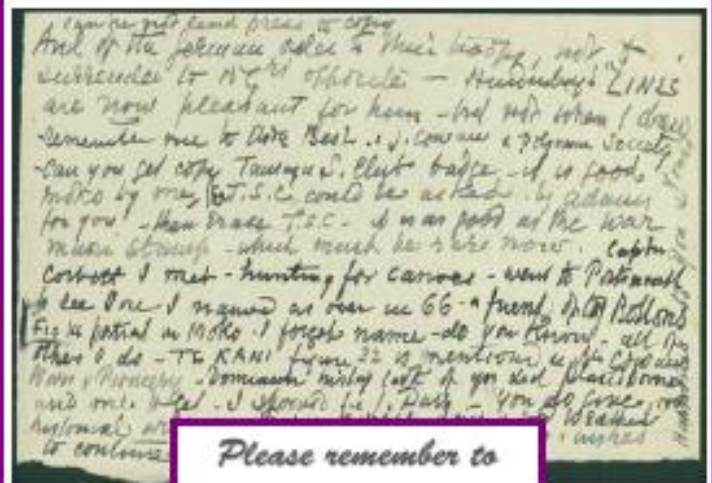
Serena Williams wins a lot of

The Structure of a

evidence for your claim, like
spiders have 8 eyes = **fact**.
