Accurate/Accuracy	You get it right! Maybe not at first, but soon. Your solution is correct because there are no conceptual, technical, or attentional errors in your solution. You keep in mind the level of correctness because you choose the appropriate measurement.
Compare	You figure out things that are the same - and possibly different (compare “contrast”, as in apples and oranges) or any two or more objects or ideas.
Contrast	You figure out things that are different, as in apples and oranges, or any two or more objects or ideas.
Comparing Numbers	You notice a number is larger $>$ or smaller $<$ or equal to $=$ another number
They're Their There	They are; a contraction with the apostrophe; those guys What they own; the dogs or property, or ideas, that belong to them A location, a specific place
Discuss/Discussion	Everybody respectfully listens and everybody talks. You share facts & opinions, contributing to a good conversation. We allow others to show different ways of thinking; we help each other think.
Persevere/Perseverance	You just keep going. You don't give up easily. You will want to give up but you will not.
Random	Statistics (Mathematics) There is an equal chance of being chosen (of or characterizing a process of selection in which each item of a set has an equal probability of being chosen.) In the English language, it means also that there is no plan or order; events are haphazard or unpredictable
Stamina	You can do a difficult thing for a long time, because you are strong in your mind. You do this because you want to achieve a goal. You persevere.
