Which one shall we choose to use?

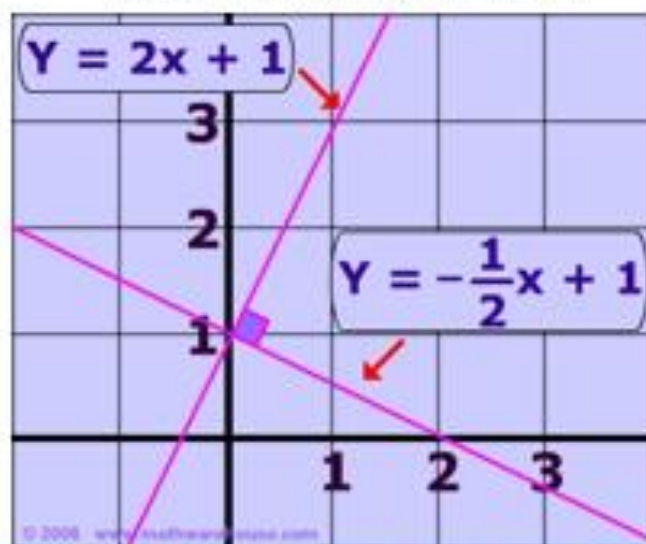

Perpendicular

In Math, you draw your lines
so they intersect at 90 degrees.
You notice the slopes of these lines
are negative reciprocals $y_1y_2 = -1$
(Like 2 and $-\frac{1}{2}$ are negative reciprocals)

Inequality

not equal...

In math, we are comparing two values and we discover they are different.

One value could be larger...

The notation $a < b$ means that a is less than (smaller than) b .

The notation $a > b$ means that a is greater than (bigger than) b .

\leq is less than or equal to

\geq is more than or equal to...

You think you see the line that forms the apparent boundary between earth and sky.

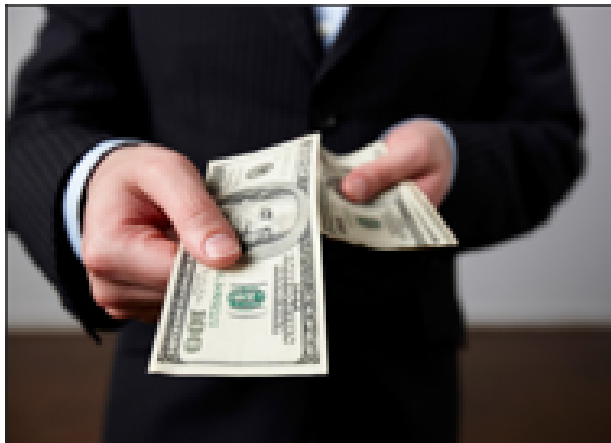

Social inequality is the existence of unequal opportunities and rewards for different social positions or statuses within a group or society

Horizontal

Something is in a flat, level position which is parallel to the *horizon.

This can also mean 'at right angles to the vertical', too.



Here we also have parallel lines that seem to go together or diminish to a **vanishing point** to create the illusion of depth.

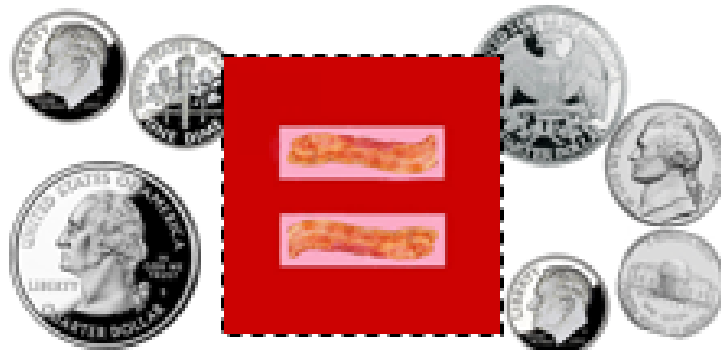
Equivalence

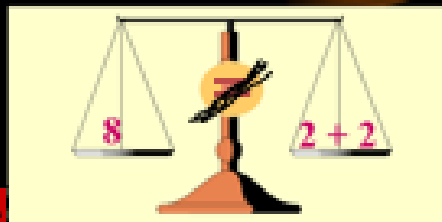
Equivalence

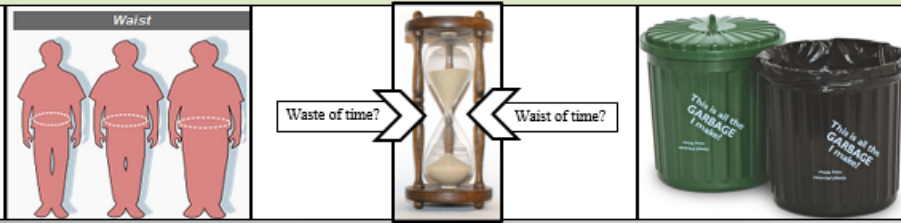
