

The 2018-2019 proposed LAND Grant Plan was voted on and unanimously approved.

Robyn Larsen addressed the need to begin a replacement protocol for projectors and other classroom technology as it becomes outdated/worn.

Dawn Hauser gave the district-projected numbers of 863 students for the 2018-2019 school year noting that we currently had 1077 registration cards turned in. In terms of staffing for the following year we are losing 2 SPED teachers and our .5 time French teacher.

Dawn Hauser gave a recap of the accreditation teams feedback. The highlights included our clean and well maintained campus, our implementation of Interdisciplinary teaming, and our intervention and extension protocol. Areas to improve were less teacher talk and more independent student work as well as better and more frequent communication from teachers to parents.

A discussion was had by all on the lack of connectivity and ease of use of the Gradebook program. Parents on the committee all voiced their frustration over the frequent crashes and that the information on Gradebook was not easy to understand. They were concerned voiced from teachers on the committee about how proficiency based grading may add another layer of complications to the already underwhelming Gradebook program.

Dawn Hauser addressed the current concerns of school safety issues in light of the school shooting in Parkland, Florida. Matheson has most doors locked during school day hours so that any visitors that come to the campus must be buzzed in by the office. Concerns were brought up that students may not know what gun shots sound like and it was advised that this is something addressed by parents in their own homes.

During the wrap up two concerns were voiced- A Cyprus student tasked with helping with the musical production was harsh to students. The need for more help and assistance for the large school plays and musicals will be addressed. The route student's use by Pleasant Green is unsafe and there is a need for a crossing guard. A possible solution could be found through a grant for a crossing light. Final successes were the school play, which was an incredible success and allowed many students the opportunity to sing and perform. Matheson is continuing to experience success through the "No Tardy Party" and is looking forward to our 4<sup>th</sup> quarter Class Act event at Classic Skating.
