

Mill Creek Elementary Community Council Meeting

Minutes from February 26, 2018

Meeting called to order 3:40pm

Those in Attendance: Aaron Walker, Dee Caldwell, Trent Eckman, Ann Kane, Harmony Starr, John Tuutau (PTA president next year)

Enrollment:

For Dual Immersion we will have 50 first graders, that is 15 more than last year. This is still 10 short overall but starting out better than last year

Next week we will get projected enrollment

Following Monday we will review that, faculty meets on Thursday

Kinder registration remains a big unknown right now

Looking for same kinder as before, one full day and two half day classes

Kinder registration is march 16th – so we will know end of March

Security:

Did have parent contact Granite SD board of education about security regarding our school. We have call into chief of police and superintendent to perform security check, knowing that we are next in line for security doors.

Aaron: We have a unique opportunity here to inform parents (who may have been more likely to enter school without checking in before) about proper school entry procedure with introduction of new rules.

With the new set-up visitors will have their ID scanned in order to get visitor badge
The scan pops up the district database which will show people on various lists

Kitchen:

Kitchen is on target, kitchen is gutted, tiles happening this week, walls are up another week maybe two without usable kitchen

Budget Considerations:

Budget is good – we are almost out of money, which is good because there won't be a problem with overage like last year

The budget plan might look different for this year compared to last year in that \$5,000 Trust money allocated to behavior... legislature is going up to \$7,000. This will be good because Playworks is going from 10 to 12 thousand. Overall the bulk of Trust money allocated for supporting reading/math.

Playworks: In explaining this program for John, Dee adds how well conflict resolution has been working this year. The kids have been doing very well learning and implementing techniques to solve their own problems and junior coaches have greatly facilitated that.

School Boundary Issues:

No decision yet on Roosevelt however there is a new elementary school being built at 900 west by metro jail, building it now – but not going to be for Roosevelt. So that may not change our boundaries. Slatted to be done the following fall but it might be even more than that.
