- Follow Up business:
 - Morning Traffic:
 - Bike lane/walking lane on Bluebell Rd heading west. Dedicated walking/biking space.
 - Parent reached out Julie Jackson. Has not reached out Holly Smith with Holladay City.
 - O Signs for the North Parking Lot. Hold off on order more signs. Will review inventory. "Pull forward" and "Exit" signs would be needed.
 - o So far, traffic on Nila Way has not been as congested as last year.
 - o Report on District Community Council Meeting (Marla Ward)
 - Working on a new Mission Statement
 - Working on language to tie in with all constituents.
 - Touched on traffic, challenges dealing with this, best options are to look within the community to find answers. Granite law enforcement is currently stretched thin.
 - Safety: Grounds safety → whether grounds are open to public while school is in session? Some adults have been playing tennis during school hours at some of the high schools.
 - o Morningside has <u>closed grounds</u> while school is in session.
 - Animal Control is responsible for the Morningside grounds to enforce dog on leash rules.
 - Granite and Holladay in negotiations to turn Spring Lane into a large park with pickleball courts and dog park. Nothing confirmed yet. Could be a two-year process.

 - o Basement assessment to ensure safety. Granite head custodian inspected and has determined that it is safe for the students.

 - o Lego Club has been successful, and other fun things from the creative lab.
