
### WHAT IS DUAL LANGUAGE IMMERSION?

Dual Language Immersion (DLI) is a free educational program available to students of all backgrounds and abilities. It is a way for students to learn regular academic content while acquiring another language at the same time. Elementary students in DLI programs typically have two teachers: one who instructs in English, and one who instruct in a target lan-



The two teachers collaborate with one another and divide the academic curriculum between English and the target language. Students spend half of their day learning in English and the other half learning in the target language.

Dual Language Immersion begins in first grade and continues through junior high and high school. Students are guided toward academic achievement, bilingualism, and cross-cultural understanding all throughout their experience in the program.








# LANGUAGE SUCCESS

## UNIVERSITY BRIDGE PROGRAM

After passing the AP [Spanish/Chinese/French] Language and Culture Exam students have a direct path to upper division college language courses. These students can earn credits that are accepted at seven Utah universities as elective credit and in some cases may be used towards a language minor.
