

Pioneer Community Council Meeting

March 8th, 2021

In Attendance: Doug Johnson, Corine Keyonnie, Maria Slo, Melissa Trujillo, John Cederlund and on the phone, Loura Texeira

Corinne moved to begin the meeting, seconded by Maria.

Agenda Item 1 was the Staffing Plan approval. With 1 person retiring, the school will be able to keep everyone else in place. This plan allocates 18 FTE, and there is room to add another depending on enrollment increase or decrease. 5th-6th tentatively have a split, but this could change. The plan was approved unanimously.

Agenda Item 2 was the Trust Lands Budget. Although it has dropped, it will pay for the paraprofessionals with \$63,000. A teacher will be paid through Title 1 funds, and for the coming year the cost of MClass will be paid by state funding.

Agenda Item 3 was the Network Realignment situation. The Granger network is still not decided, because of the West Lake situation and uncertainty about its future. Mr. Johnson stated the decision could be 3 years out because of West Lake's status as a feeder school.

Agenda Item 4 was the upcoming 4th quarter situation at Pioneer. As of now, there are 85 students distant learning, and 10 students have not been tested for WIDA. Rise testing begins on April 9th, and distance learning students will be able to come in on Fridays or during regular class testing time. The results of the testing this year will not be used for teacher evaluation purposes, but the results will still be useful. Distance learning students are able to take practice tests at home, but must come in for the actual test.

At this point, the meeting was adjourned without further discussion.
