

Pioneer Community Council Meeting Minutes
January 10th,2022

Meeting commenced at 4:00 p.m. In attendance: Doug Johnson, Grant Bushman, Corine Keyonnie, Maria Sio, John Cederlund

Corine moved to open the meeting, John seconded.

1st item of Business was an update on the Trust Funds Budget. It is currently on track. The money that was initially allocated for chromebook has been freed up as the district is now upgrading the chromebooks with money from their budget.

2nd, The Trust Funds money has now been redirected to use on View Sonic Boards for all the classroom teachers. This is an upgrade from the current Smartboards.

3rd item was a discussion of the mask mandate. This has been a smooth transition, students are complying and the school has plenty of masks available. No problems or issues were reported.

4th, we discussed the information we were able to obtain concerning parents access to Portal. The district provided some reports but they are raw data and not very useful. For example the info shows there were 104 logins in the calendar year but doesn't provide much else. We had a discussion on how to use the data and Maria and Grant offer to compile a spreadsheet, but it would be time consuming and of limited help. Going forward, Corine offered to train parents on Portal usage.

5th, Doug told us that Focus School Software is on the way and will be replacing the current Discovery system. The time frame for this is uncertain and may be next year or so.

6th, non attendance days were added to the schedule by the district. The dates are January 28th, March 11th, and April 29th. These are all Fridays. The Thursday prior to these days will NOT be early dismissal days. These days are designated as teacher planning days.

7th, the school has a number of openings include 2 motor aides, Title 1 paraeducators and recess aides. We need to get the word out and fill these spots.

Finally, Grant proposed hosting a morale boosting event on a non attendance day. There was mixed feedback on this, and he was advised to provide more information and we could see if teachers would be interested.

Maria moved to end the meeting, and Corine seconded the motion.
