Do you have any other ideas?

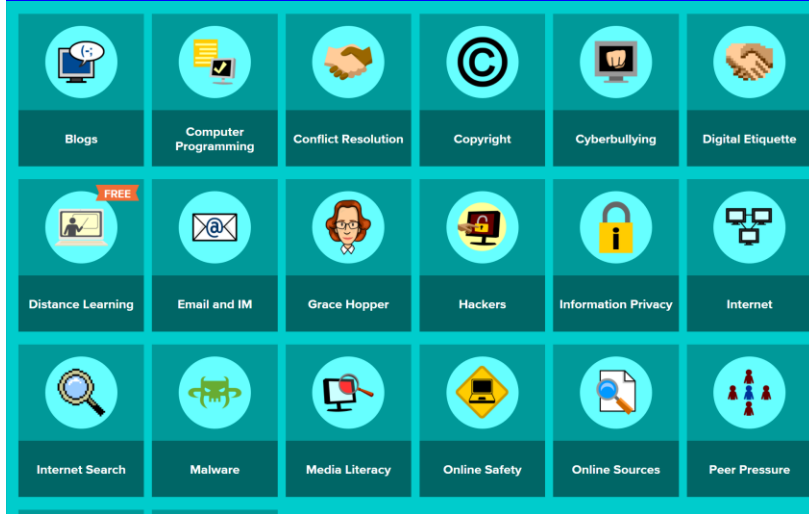
Ms. Vantrease shared an idea about "buying" an interventionist. We have seen some real student growth this year because there are people who are available to run small groups, more than usual.

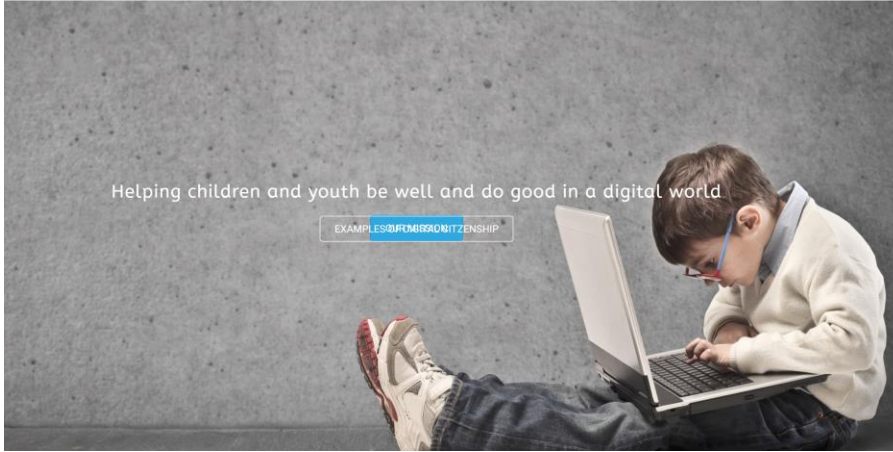
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
