Our plan for this year:

This year we have \$61,302 *we are using the money to pay for a teacher to help lower class size. This year, it is in 3rd grade.

Our 3 school goals:


1. 65% of students in grades K-5 will make average or above average progress on Dibels by the end of the year.

We are on track to reach this goal. We are already at 63%.

- 65% of students will make average or above average progress on Acadience Math or 80% of students will be proficient at basic math calculations
 We are keeping track of this goal but don't know yet if the progress is typical.
- At least 40% of students will meet their WIDA target goal.
 We are actively working on this goal, also. WIDA tests are going on right now.

Priority standards for math:

Each grade level has worked together to choose the most essential standards/skills in math. They also worked with the grade level before and after to make sure that the standards we have were consecutive.



Ben Horsley-District Rep to talk about reconfiguration. Mr. Horsley reported the process for grade reconfiguration which Redwood has already participated in. Now, the district will be finishing upthe other networks and has a similar process.
